### 10/19 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Cllr Patten advised that the workers bonus system had been suspended when the new administration took office in July. She also has a meeting with the Royal Derby Hospital and asked that any issue be referred to her. Derbyshire Trading Standards had carried out an egg production crackdown after over 40% of production failed the tests - there were 857 egg producers in Derbyshire. A new grant 'Help bringing People Together' was available of up to £2,000 to help bring faith groups together.

The Footpath Officer had advised that the Ranger Service would be erecting the kissing gates shortly whilst the clerk advised that he was still awaiting a response from Mr Legh, the land agent to the Shemlt Estate. The Manor Farm Holly hedge was still considered by some to be too overgrown. A response was still awaited from the Highways Agency. The District Council had approved a new method of allocating s136 monies as a result of which the Parish would receive £1,725 an increase of over £700.

The Chair outlined the need to prepare a comprehensive response to this important consultation which would determine the direction of development in South Derbyshire to 2026. Members made known their concerns.

10/27 DOG FOULING PILOT STUDY

The Clerk advised that the scheme seemed to be supported but had received two complaints. The first concerned the siting of a bin outside someone's property which has since been relocated. The other concerned the use and siting of posts which were considered to be a risk to passing cyclists/horse riders who could be impaled in a fall.

The parishioner wished to have his concerns minuted and a risk assessment to be undertaken.

**Resolved:** That the pilot be continued and that Cllrs Nesbitt and Riley revisit the locations and carry out a risk assessment.

This was given in the Annual Parish meeting earlier.

10/29 TO RECEIVE ANY REPORTS FROM REPRESENTATIVES ON OUTSIDE BODIES

The Safer Neighbourhood meeting had been held in the Memorial Hall and there were a lot of complaints about the acoustics. The WI had raised funds for two acoustic screens but more were needed. Ian Hay has since met with the Memorial Hall Trustees and advised them to bid for a grant from the Community Fund. Several complaints were made about vehicles speeding through the village. Volunteers were requested to be put forward to the Speedwatch campaign. A speaker for the Airport Police advised that security checks were being made at all airfields, including Egginton, in relation to terrorism checks. The Police Station in Hilton remains without a telephone and is still not fully operational. Cllr Cowley advised that Biffa had increased security measures following thefts from the depot. They also wish to install electronic gates on Boundary Road.
